# The Digital Revolution by Vinnie Kempf

The digital revolution continues and I believe the next "sea change" is upon us. It changes the manner in which International Salon Exhibitions will be conducted in the future.

The 1<sup>st</sup> Suncoast Virtual Salon an International exhibition in the PSA Electronic Imaging Division and sponsored by the Central Florida Chapter of PSA will be conducted on April 27, 2002. This will be the first International exhibition, as far as I know, conducted in the United States in which all images submitted will be in digital file formand will not involve any physical transmission of slides. A salon of this type was conducted a year or so ago in Argentina so this is not the first such salon in the world. Your images do not have to be computer manipulated to compete in this salon they simply have to be digitized for submission. The theme of this competition is general so any image is acceptable.

You can go to the following link http://www.photographybuynick.com to find the rules and forms for sub-mission. The only physical paper that is transmitted is the money for the entry fees (they do not take credit cards or Pay Pal transfers).

If you have some images for submission, 4 is the maximum, I believe it would be great to support this startup operation. Who cares if you get an acceptance, you can still have bragging rights that you participated in the first of a kind in the U.S. It costs only \$6.00 for an entry of 4 images.

I believe that this salon represents a "sea change" in how future salons in other divisions will be conducted. It is also a precursor of how camera club competitions will be held. Once a critical mass of salons and camera clubs move to this competition technique I believe you will see a precipitous drop in the use of slide film. At that point camera club photographers will join the ranks of photojournalists, fashion and wedding photographers who have migrated to this new film medium and will start capturing images on digital film and entering their digital slides in competitions.

Why not be one of the leaders and join this revolution by submitting your slides to the 1<sup>st</sup> Suncoast Virtual Salon. You need to hurry a bit since the closing date is April 20<sup>th</sup>.

**New Moon** -- when the Moon is not illuminated by direct sunlight.

**Waxing Crescent** -- occurs when the visible Moon is partly but less than one-half illuminated by direct sunlight while the illuminated part is increasing.

**First Quarter** -- when one-half of the Moon appears illuminated by direct sunlight while the illuminated part is increasing. **Waxing Gibbous** -- when the Moon is more than one-half but not fully illuminated by direct sunlight while the illuminated part is increasing.

Full Moon -- when the visible Moon is fully illuminated by direct sunlight.

Waning Gibbous -- the Moon is less than fully but more than one-half illuminated by direct sunlight while the illuminated part is decreasing.

**Last Quarter** -- is when one-half of the Moon appears illuminated by direct sunlight while the illuminated part is decreasing.

**Waning Crescent** -- occurs when the Moon is partly but less than one-half illuminated by direct sunlight while the illuminated part is decreasing.
